KS1 Christmas Production

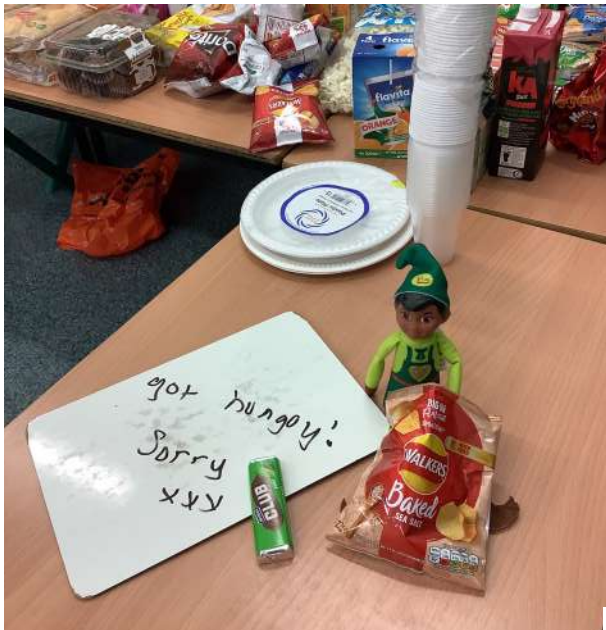

What's Volunteer Police Cadets?

We are Volunteer Uniform Youth Group that is supported and run by Metropolitan Police Service. Established since 1987 and have grown to over 5000 cadets, with at least one Senior and one Junior unit in every borough.

Junior Police Cadets

Junior Police Cadets are aged 10-13yrs and our new Panda unit aged from school years 3—5. It aims to teach young people life skills and social responsibility in a fun and engaging environment. These units are led by Senior Cadets supported by VPC staff, allowing them to be positive role models to their youngest peers.

Senior Police Cadets

The cadets meet once a week and often perform duties in support of local policing. They also take part in large public events like Trooping the Colour, Remembrance Day Parades, London Marathon and Notting Hill Carnival. There are also various cadet competitions held throughout the year where units compete against each other. Cadets work through a national curriculum which is accredited by ASDAN and all these activities can be used to complete the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Questions to ask after school- instead of 'What did you do today?'

Do you ever wish you could be a fly on the wall at your child's school? As a parent, sending your child to school can bring up all sorts of feelings. More than anything, you may be feeling **curious**: what did they do? How did they behave? How do they act when you are not there? And many of you may also have realised that asking your child 'How was your day?' doesn't always encourage them to share their experiences.

How can parents help?

Give them some time before asking them lots of questions at pick-up: they may be tired and will need to reconnect with you first. Try to chat casually and to ask open-ended questions. If they aren't ready to answer, just pause and come back to it later: perhaps as you are playing, eating together or during bath time. Here are a few examples of questions you can ask instead:

1. What was the funniest/silliest thing that happened today?
2. What games did you play in the playground?
3. Did anyone do anything super nice for you? What was the kindest thing you did for someone else?
4. How would you rate your day on a scale of 1-10?
5. What is something you would have liked to do differently today?
6. What made you smile today?
7. Which rule was the hardest to follow?
8. Did you make a new friend today? What's their name? What do you like about them?
9. Is there anything you would like help with?
10. If you were a teacher/head of the school, what would your class/school be like?

Attendance and Punctuality

The first days back really matter!

Good school attendance is one of the main factors in determining your child's future and opportunities in life.

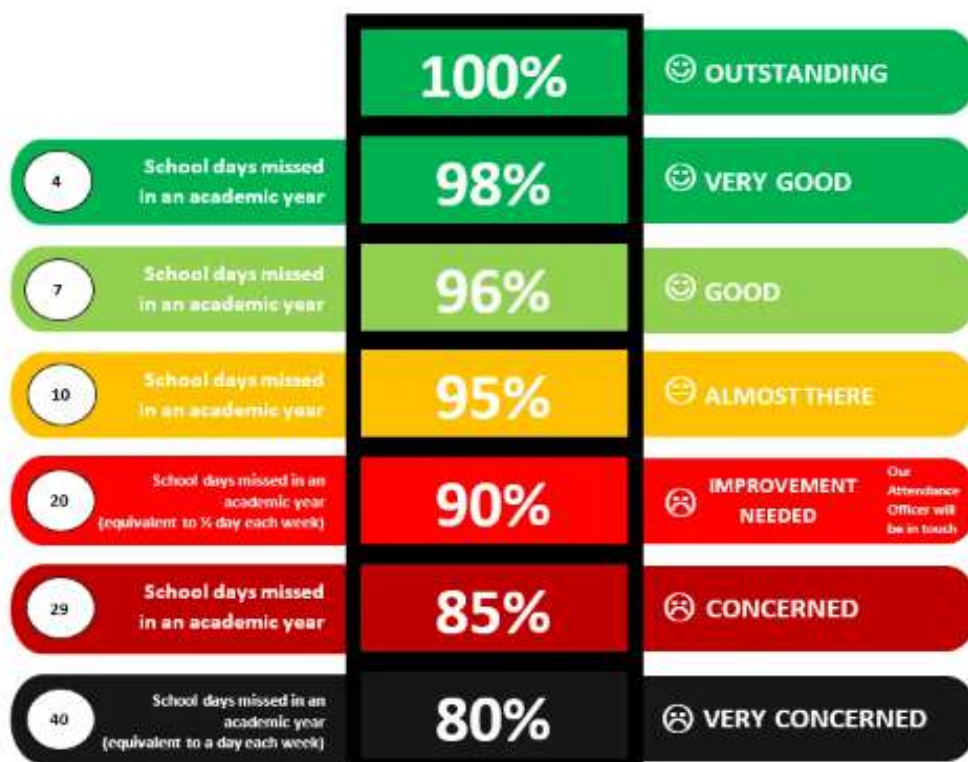
Evidence from a recent report showed that children who miss days 2, 3 and 4 of the new term for unauthorised reasons had a predicted overall absence of almost 45%, or 31 days across the term, compared to children who missed days near the end of term, with a predicted overall absence of 20-30%.

So, we ask all parents/carers to continue the excellent work you do each day to support children to attend from the first day of term.

Pupils should be in school on time, all day, everyday, except when they are too unwell/sick to attend. NHS advises that it is fine to send children to school with minor coughs and colds: [NHS advises](#)

Do NOT take your child out of school to go abroad for an extended holiday or leave of absence during term-time. All unauthorised absences will receive a penalty notice fine from Ealing Council.
